Calculating a GPA – 8th Grade

You know your student the best, so the following talking points are simply a guideline to use in starting a conversation with your 8th grader about understanding how a grade point average (GPA) is calculated will help you and your student set and revise goals and expectations as high school progresses.

- Do you know what a GPA is? It stands for "grade point average," and it's a way for schools and employers to see how well you're doing in high school without looking at every single grade you've earned. It's a good indicator of how hard you work in high school.

- It's a lot easier to start with good grades to maintain a high cumulative GPA. You can't make up for poor grades if you wait too late.
