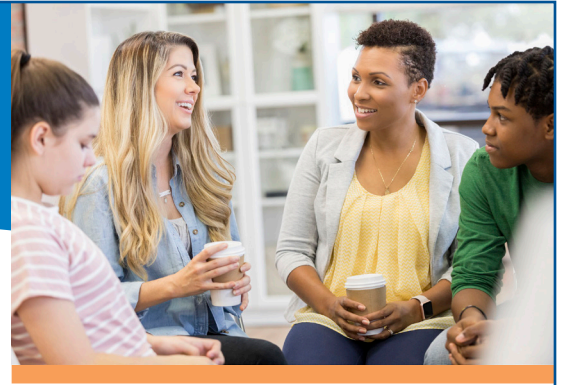


# SP<sup>3</sup> - Student Planning Pointers for Parents



## Conversation Starters

### Sophomores Are in a Sweet Spot – 9th Grade

You know your student the best, so the following talking points are simply a guideline to use in starting a conversation with your 9th grader that while it may seem too early to search for scholarships, if your student is headed to college, this is no time to experience a “sophomore slump.” Now that high school jitters are hopefully over, your sophomore can begin looking ahead.
